




DINOSAUR rEVOLUTION: SECRETS OF SURVIVAL 10 JULY-26 SEPTEMBER






IN THE VALLEY: EIGHT WORKS FROM THE VICTORIA UNIVERSITY OF WELLINGTON ART COLLECTION 2 OCTOBER - 12 DECEMBER

In The Valley places four seminal works from the 60s and 70s on Ioan from Te Herenga Waka Victoria University of Wellington art collection in conversation with more recent acquisitions. Featuring work by Colin McCahon, Gordon Walters, Ralph Hotere Fred Graham, Ava Seymour, Ronnie Van Hout, Brett Graham and Robert Jahnke, this is a rare opportunity to see some of New Zealand's most prominent artists, in their first visit to the valley.

ON THE STREETS 18 DECEMBER - 6 FEBRUARY 2022

18 Maritimes is a suite of small tapestries depicting oceanic and nautical themes by textile artist Gordon Crook, on loan from The Dowse Art Museum. Crook took two years to complete the designs researching pictures of fish, seaweed, and microscopic organisms. The finished series, is a significant body of work which exquisitely portrays Crook's expressive design and his abundant use of colour.

REMEMBERING RODIN 4 DECEMBER - 20 FEBRUARY 2022

French sculptor Auguste Rodin was the sculptor of the superstars and one of the most famous artists in the world in the 1900s. This intimate exhibition, toured by Te Papa, Tongarewa Museum of New Zealand features the bronze statuette, Eve, bought straight from the Musée Rodin by the National Art Gallery in 1959.
